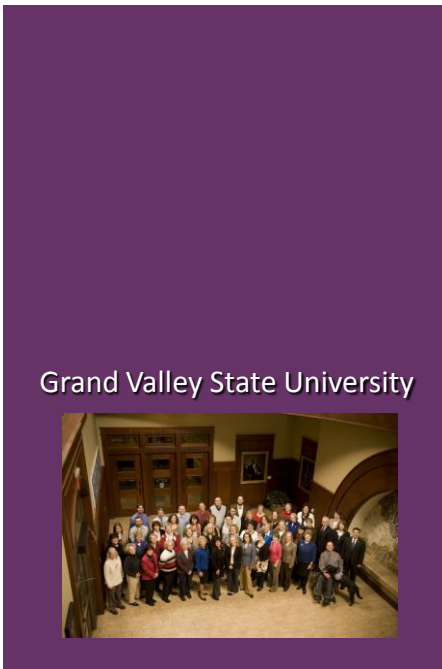
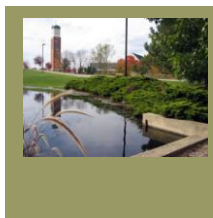

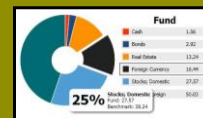

WHAT'S IMPORTANT TO HOOSIER COMPANIES?

Critical thinking/problem solving, oral communication, and professional/work ethic were the three most frequently mentioned skills necessary to being successful in one's career. This is not surprising but is concerning when we contrast that with ratings on how well college graduates and the current workforce as a whole perform in these areas, which we will see in the next section.

Below are the skills that at least nine out of ten indicated are necessary to being successful in one's career:

- Critical Thinking/Problem Solving
- Oral Communication
- Professionalism/Work Ethic
- Serving All Clients/Customers
- Reading Comprehension
- English Language
- Teamwork/Collaboration
- Written Communication

UNPREPARED GRADS

The perception of college graduate skill preparedness is very poor. Listed below are how Indiana companies rated college graduates on the areas they felt were most important. The percentage is the total rated as excellent and very good. The findings indicate college graduates are not prepared for the day-to-day aspects of a job.

Critical Thinking/Problem Solving	25%
Oral Communication	25%
Professionalism/Work Ethic	18%
Serving All Clients/Customers	18%
Reading Comprehension	31%
English Language	41%
Teamwork/Collaboration	29%
Written Communication	18%

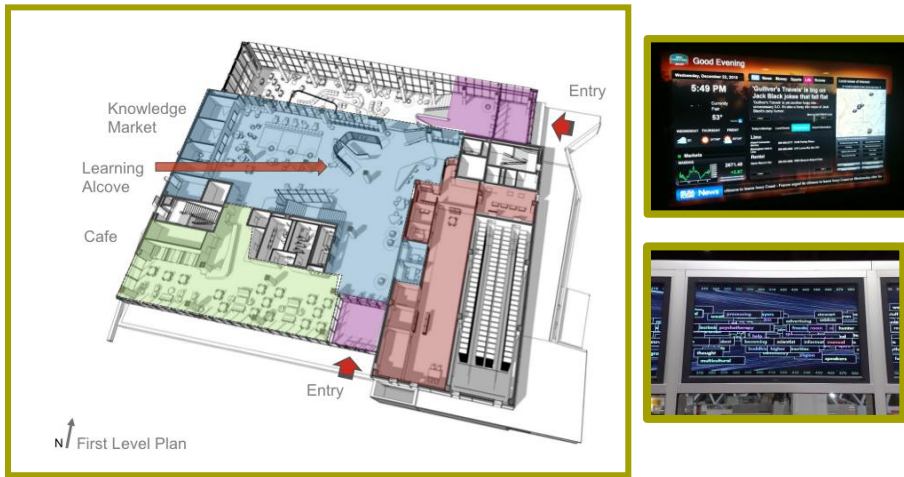

Idema Pew Library on GVSU's Allendale campus could raise bar on energy efficiency

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Construction of the **Mary Idema Pew Library Learning and Information Commons** on Grand Valley State University's Allendale campus includes so many energy-saving design aspects and high-efficiency materials that the facility will consume half the energy of a typical library its size.

That's the word from Scott Veine, project manager for **Pioneer Construction**, who is overseeing the project.

"We took the base model of a library that met all the program needs of GVSU and worked with Pacific Northwest National Laboratories, a subsidiary of the Department of Energy, to cut 50 percent of the energy consumption," Veine says. "We've successfully completed that over the course of the last year and we're now implementing what the DOE gave us."

The 150,000-square-foot building will have five stories, 80 percent of which have raised floors with 18

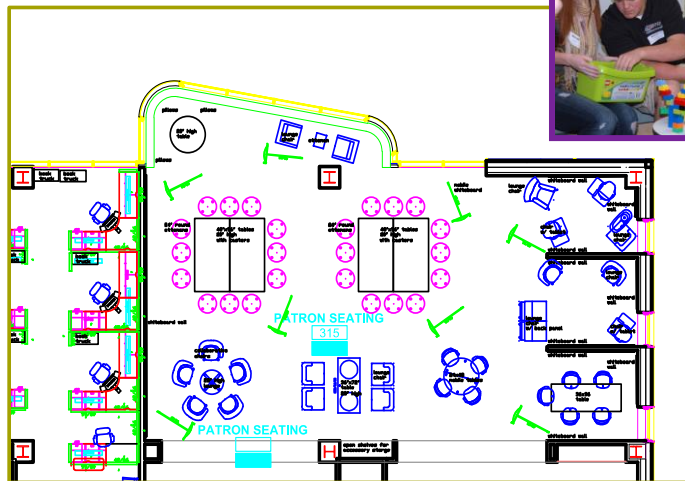

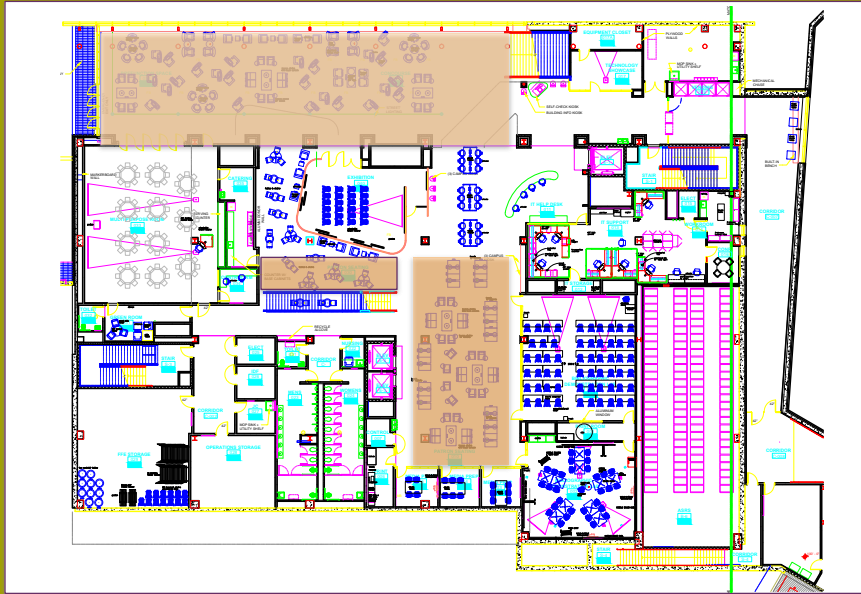

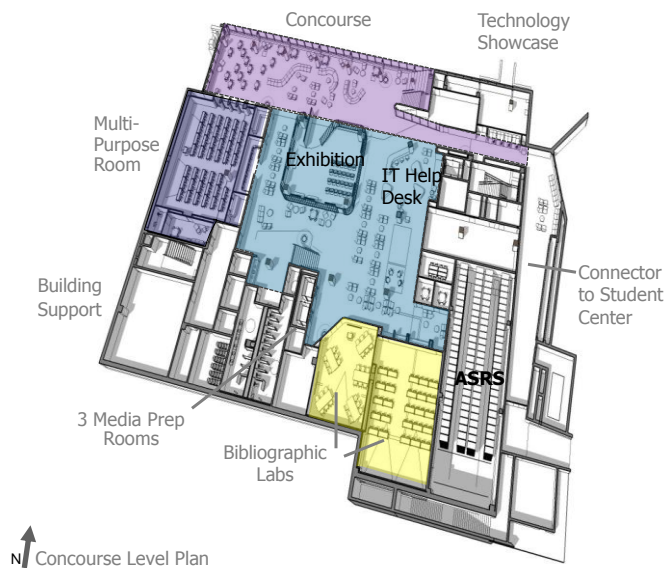

Concourse Level

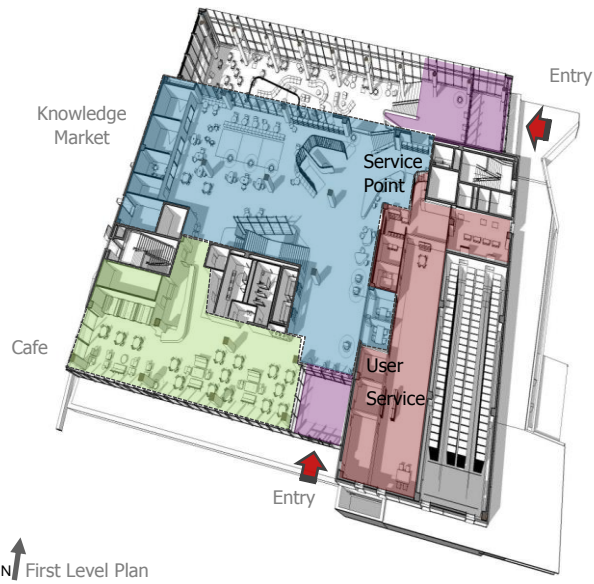

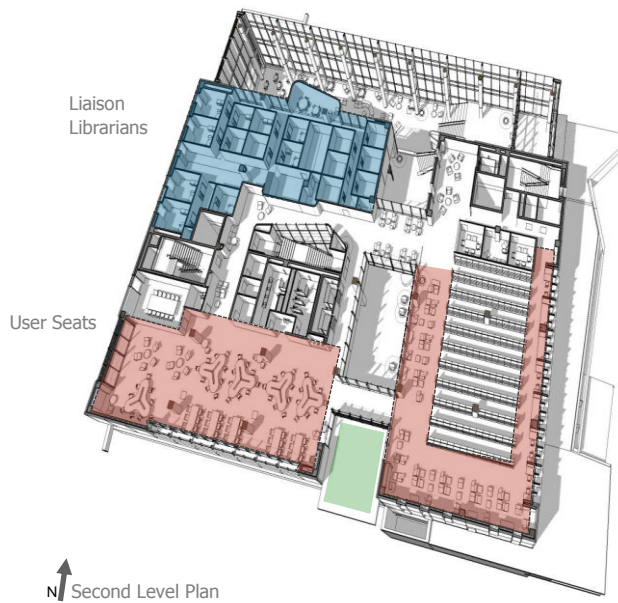


Concourse Level Plan

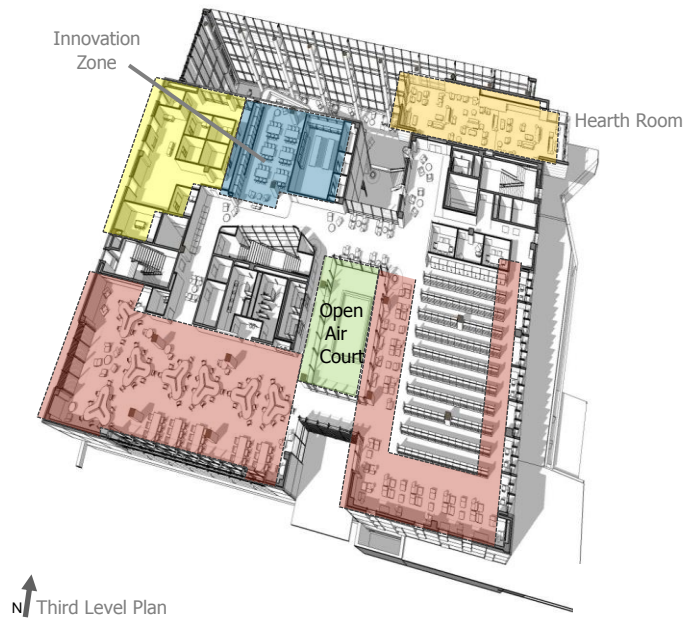

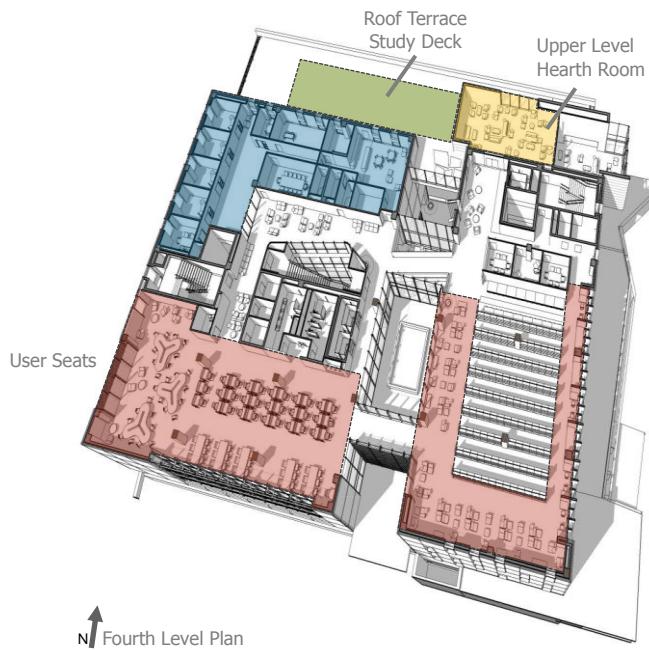
